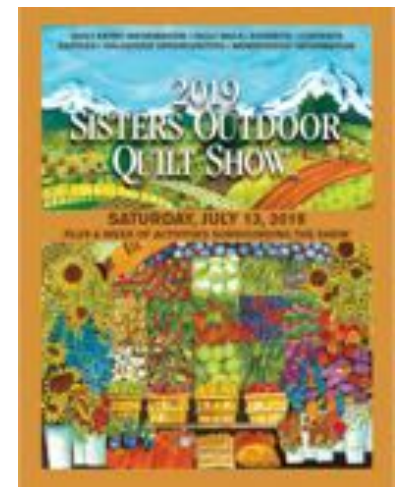
Hi Ladies,
