"Page 38 Challenge"

You have been challenged to find a non-quilting, non-crafting book and turn to page 38. Take inspiration from that page and create a quilt! You may be inspired by the colors, or the design of something on the page. The overall layout of the page may make for great inspiration in a non-traditional quilt layout. It might just be an ad with lots of type, but what a great idea for all those cool type print fabrics. It



may be something as small as the color of the page title, or as simple as the page number 38. I've seen some great home layouts in some of the magazines I've looked at that have provided multiple inspiration ideas. Now to size... We want it to mimic the size/shape of a page, 8.5 x 11. So, if you multiply those numbers by 2, 3, 4, or 25, that's the size of your quilt. Example (8.5 x 11) by 3 equals 25.5 x 33, (8.5 x 11) by 5 equals 42.5 x 55. Also, keep the page. Take it out of the magazine. I will have page protectors available at our June meeting. The page will be pinned to the quilt. On the page, write what magazine the page came from.

Have fun!!! I can't wait to see the results!
