Budget Committee

The proposed 2020 Budget will be emailed to all 2019 members before November 4th. It is a transition Budget due to the need to rent meeting room space while PIC is under construction, in addition to incorporating rental of storage space for quilt frames and other show items. The major Budget changes are:

REVENUES: includes a dues increase from \$25 to \$45 and reduces expected revenue from raffle ticket sales.

EXPENDITURES: includes monthly general meeting room rent, monthly Board meeting room rent, increased liability insurance for the quilt show, and storage unit rental for quilt frames.

Bottom line the budget is balanced however, relies on \$3,482.11 from Reserves. After yearend, the figures will be adjusted based on actual 2019 spending and the Reserve amount will likely reduce. This will be reflected in January when the Membership will vote on the final 2020 budget.
