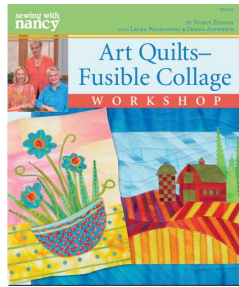

# Community Quilts

Thank you again to all our talented Community Quilts quilters! And a special thanks to everyone who participated in the September project. We saw many tops completed already and they are all so pretty! Just so you are aware of our needs at this time, we especially need more quilts for 8 to 12 year old boys and girls. There are lots of fun themes for kid quilts such as sports, Star Wars, plush animals, superheroes, space, science, or animal themes just to name a few. Boys and girl quilts should be 50 to 55". We have lots of toddler quilts at this time.

**OCTOBER PROJECT:** The project for Wednesday, October 16 will use our Cutting Machine. Community Quilts has a cutting machine that cuts three different sizes for making quilts. On Wednesday, October 16<sup>th</sup> we will bring the machine (it's big) to Community Quilts for anyone to cut fabric for a quilt. You may cut from Community Quilts fabric for a community quilt, or cut your own fabric for a personal quilt. There are 3 plates, which can each cut up to 8 layers at a time:

1. Eight 5" square
2. Five 2 1/2" strips

3. One 8 1/2" square, three 4 1/2" squares and one 8 1/2"x4 1/2" rectangle, which makes into a 12 1/2" unfinished block (see picture attached).

Please prepare your fabric before coming to CQ on October 16<sup>th</sup>. Fabric should be a good quality cotton. Very thin cotton does not cut well.

**For Plate 1:** Cut fabric into 11" x 21" pieces. Pieces can be slightly over 11" but not less than 11". Length can be slightly shorter if you are using scraps, but you will get fewer squares.

**For Plate 2:** Cut fabric 23 1/2" x 12 1/2". You can fold the width of the fabric in half for the length, just remember that counts for two layers. It should not be longer than 23 1/2". It can be a bit wider than 12 1/2". If it is less than 12 1/2" you will get fewer strips.

**For Plate 3:** Cut fabric at least 14 1/2" x 14 1/2". It can be slightly bigger but not smaller.



**JOIN US:** Join us on Wednesdays for a fun day of sewing. Bring a lunch! Once your top is finished, we provide batting and backing to complete your project. Wednesday meetings are at Nativity Lutheran Church from 11:00 AM to 2:30 PM at 60850 Brosterhouse Rd.

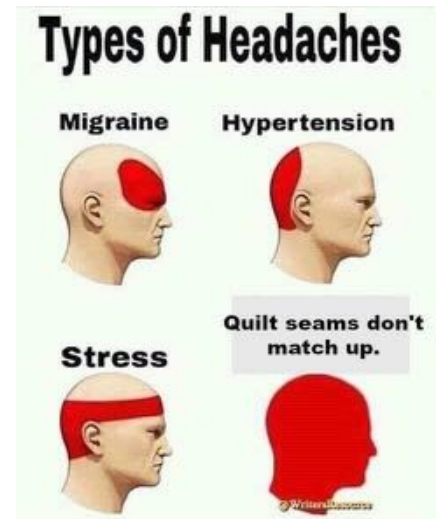
