### **Ricky Tims' Convergence Quilts**

If you are interested in making a quilt using a progressive abstract scale of one inch, one and half inch, etc, this book will show you how to layer the fabric choices, cut both vertically and horizontally and then rearrange the strips into a pleasing piece. **Convergence quilts** feature two or more fabrics cut into strips, sewn together, then cut and pieced again. Ricky prefers his hand dyed fabrics; so many of his pieces are solids and ombre fabrics. Prints and batiks can be combined but care has to be taken to make sure the fabrics blends and contrasts well. Making a piece will produce a moderate table topper but regular quilt sizes projects can be created by cutting more complementary fabric and adding several borders.
