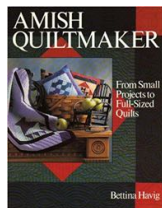

Community Quilts

Thank you to all our talented Community Quilts quilters and dedicated Quilt Show volunteers!

RAFFLE: At the Guild Meeting on September 9th, a raffle prize will be given to one lucky winner! If you are doing a numbered CQ kit, it must be



completed and handed in to Diana or Billie BEFORE the September 9th meeting.

SEPTEMBER PROJECT: The project for Wednesday, September 11th will be made from quilt kits prepared by the famous Bev Piper. Kits contain 5" squares, but set in a different design than our Spring project.

OCTOBER PROJECT: The project for Wednesday, October 16th will use our Cutting Machine. Did you know that Community Quilts has a cutting machine that cuts three different sizes for making quilts? On October 16th we will bring the machine (it's big) to Community Quilts for anyone to cut fabric for a quilt. You may cut from Community Quilts fabric for a community quilt, or cut your own fabric for a personal quilt. There are 3 plates which can each cut up to 8 layers at a time:

1. Eight 5" square
2. Five 2 1/2" strips
3. One 8 1/2" square, three 4 1/2" squares and one 8 1/2"x4 1/2" rectangle, which makes into a 12 1/2" unfinished block (see picture attached).



To prepare fabric for the machine, please do the following before coming to CQ on October 16th. Fabric should be of a good quality cotton. Very thin cotton does not cut well.

For Plate 1: Cut fabric into 11" x 21" pieces. Pieces can be slightly over 11" but not

less than 11". Length can be slightly shorter if you are using scraps, but you will get fewer squares.

For Plate 2: Cut fabric 23 1/2" x 12 1/2". You can fold the width of the fabric in half for the length; just remember that counts for two layers. It should not be longer than 23 1/2". It can be a bit wider than 12 1/2". If it is less than 12 1/2" you will get fewer strips.

For Plate 3: Cut fabric at least 14 1/2" x 14 1/2". It can be slightly bigger but not smaller.

JOIN US: Join us on Wednesdays for a fun day of sewing. Bring a lunch! Once your top is finished, we provide batting and backing to complete your project. Wednesday meetings are at Nativity Lutheran Church from 11:00 AM to 2:30 PM at 60850 Brosterhouse Rd.

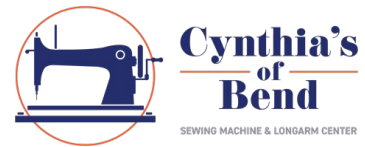
