

Virtual Show & Tell for Guild Members

While we are all going through this difficult social distancing time I would like to offer a little bit of fun and a way for us to keep in touch. We will do a virtual show and tell on the blog. The frequency of posting will depend on how many submissions I get. I anticipate posting once a week perhaps, but I really don't know how many submissions I'll get.

If you'd like to participate please send a photo of your current project (in progress or finished). Please state how you would like your name to be posted (full name or first name with last initial), and just one sentence of explanation if needed.

Photography tips: Try to take your photo with your camera perpendicular to the quilt (i.e.- put the quilt on a design wall, or have someone hold it up). If you lay it on the floor, do your best to get the camera centered over it. The sides of the quilt will be parallel to the sides of the photo. I will not have time to edit the photos, so I would prefer that you do any editing yourself. A phone photo is fine, just be sure to take your photo in natural light and get close enough to your project so that you don't need to crop the photo too much. We want the resolution to be as high as possible. Send your photo to me with largest size possible.

I was thinking it would be fun to see people's sewing rooms in whole or just a favorite part, so that can



be added to the show & tell of quilts. Or quilting with pets photos.

New Non-Profit in Bend

Corni Quinlivan has shared of a new non profit in Bend for homeless veterans. There is a partnership with the City of Bend, Deschutes County, Central Oregon Veterans' Outreach and several businesses. The current plan is for there to be 10-12 mini housing with a communal building for cooking, laundry and bathrooms. The hope is to have it completed by winter. The land has been donated by the county and the sheriffs' department. Corni said there was a conversation regarding a request for quilts for the residents. Corni has offered to quilt them all for free. It was discussed to ask Corni to have them send a letter making this request as it needs to be discussed and approved by the board before we add another quilt recipient group.

The plan is to have the shelter community built by next fall, behind the Deschutes County Public Safety Campus near the Sheriff's Office. Supplies for 15 tiny homes are already in Bend, and volunteers are working to assemble and paint the small cottages. Tobiason presented the proposal to the Deschutes County Commissioners Jan. 27. Now, county staff are drafting a memorandum of understanding with COVO and the Bend Heroes Foundation, establishing an agreement to lease the land owned by Deschutes County to the nonprofits.

COVO will help with behavioral and physical health services, job training and the eventual transition to more independent living. The Deschutes County Stabilization Center is scheduled to open this spring on the same campus as the village, adding an additional safety net. DCSC was designed as an alternative for people in crisis so they don't have to go to the emergency room or to jail.

Phase Two of the project is to build high-density, long-term, affordable housing with on-site or nearby access to ongoing support. Tobiason is working with the City and County to find more public land that could be donated to the cause.


